## Low-Water and Drought-**Resistant Plants**

Plants that are adapted to long, dry summers and short, rainy winters are called "Mediterranean-zone" plants. These include plants that are native to California, as well as those that originated in southern Europe, South America, and other "Mediterranean" climates. These plants don't need much water in the summer and have thrived in water-scarce conditions for thousands of years. The plants listed on the next page are appropriate for California's climate and use less water than what you may already have in your garden. Continued on page 2
